**Promote, Encourage, Innovate ARTS**

**CHILDREN'S ORCHESTRA SOCIETY - \$10,000** to support a scholarship program for needy and worthy student musicians.

**CINEMA ARTS CENTRE - \$20,000** to update a nonprofit community cinema with digital projection technology.

**EAST END ARTS & HUMANITIES COUNCIL - \$10,000** to support an arts program geared toward economic and community development.

**LONG ISLAND ARTS ALLIANCE - \$20,000** for the annual Arts Alive LI Arts and Culture Festival that encourages collaboration, showcases Long Island's cultural assets, and fosters economic development.

**Stewards of Our Environment**

**CITIZENS CAMPAIGN FUND FOR THE ENVIRONMENT - \$20,000** support to promote a campaign for the safe disposal of pharmaceuticals by Long Island healthcare institutions and the public.

**LONG ISLAND VOLUNTEER CENTER - \$20,000** to operate Volunteer Recovery Center (VRC) and disaster relief and recovery activities through June 2013.

**TOURO COLLEGE - \$20,000** to operate a free disaster relief legal clinic to address critical legal needs resulting from Superstorm Sandy.

**MAKE THE ROAD NEW YORK - \$15,000** for safety training and legal advocacy for immigrant workers on Long Island.

**NEW YORK COMMUNITIES FOR CHANGE - \$15,000** to assess the health needs of low-income seniors in Long Beach and mobilize them to advocate for improved services.

**NORTH SHORE CHILD & FAMILY GUIDANCE ASSOCIATION - \$15,000** to provide mental health services for Hurricane Sandy survivors.

**ROOSEVELT COMMUNITY REVITALIZATION GROUP - \$30,000** to form a COAD in partnership with the Fire Department.

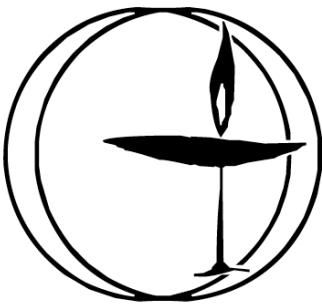
**UNITED POLICYHOLDERS - \$15,000** to provide home insurance assistance for Long Islanders and help them strengthen their financial safety nets.

**FIVE TOWNS COMMUNITY CENTER - \$12,500** to solicit and coordinate resources to help 500 Inwood residents in recovery efforts, including continuing to serve as a warming center during severe weather, distributing clothing, shoes, and supplies as needed.

**LONG BEACH LATINO CIVIC ASSOCIATION - \$12,500** to perform case management for 450 local residents struggling to recover from Hurricane Sandy, including intake, assessment, home visits, referrals and follow up; develop roundtable discussion ground led by bi-lingual mental health professional to aid in recovery process.

The Long Island Unitarian Universalist Fund is a field-of interest fund in the Long Island Community Foundation that promotes progressive social change. The fund was established by the Unitarian Universalist Veatch Program at Shelter Rock. Grants are made in response to competitive proposals received from Long Island nonprofit organizations. The proposals are reviewed by LICF staff and presented to an advisory committee, composed of members drawn from UU congregations across Long Island.

**CHILD CARE COUNCIL OF SUFFOLK - \$15,000** to fund leadership and advocacy training for low-income parents in Islip.

**ERASE RACISM, INC. - \$20,000** to hire a community organizer to execute a strategic outreach campaign for fair housing.

**HERSTORY WRITER'S WORKSHOP - \$10,000** to enable those directly affected by injustices to advocate for changes in social policies.

**HUNTINGTON TOWNSHIP HOUSING COALITION - \$7,000** for an affordable rental housing campaign in the Town of Huntington.

**LONG ISLAND CENTER FOR NONPROFIT LEADERSHIP AT ADELPHI - \$35,000** to support a new array of organizational capacity-building programs and services for LIUU grantee organizations.
