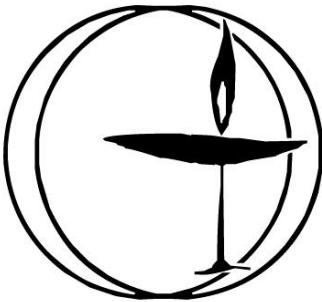


**THE LONG ISLAND UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST FUND
2018 GRANTS TOTALING \$242,000.00**



The Long Island Unitarian Universalist Fund is a field-of interest fund in the Long Island Community Foundation that promotes progressive social change. The fund was established by the Unitarian Universalist Veatch Program at Shelter Rock. Grants are made in response to competitive proposals received from Long Island nonprofit organizations. The proposals are reviewed by LICF staff and presented to an advisory committee, composed of members drawn from UU congregations across Long Island.

Alliance for Quality Education, \$20,000.00 for continued support for local organizing work to advance education equity on Long Island.

Birth Justice Warriors, \$17,000.00 support to reduce black maternal and infant mortality in Nassau County.

Domestic Harmony Foundation, \$20,000.00 support to provide cultural sensitivity training for police personnel in communities with high concentrations of South Asian and Muslim populations.

ERASE Racism, \$20,000.00 to support an education equity initiative including a student led advocacy campaign.

Herstory Writer's Workshop, \$20,000.00 for a story-based strategy to build bridges between immigrant youth and their native-born peers and promote school policy change.

Littig House Community Center, \$20,000.00 for continued support of an advocacy campaign to increase funding for services for youth and families.

New Hour for Women and Children LI, \$20,000.00 to support a leadership development and advocacy training program that empowers formerly incarcerated women.

New York Communities Organizing Fund, Inc., \$25,000.00 for neighborhood-level organizing initiatives to combat poverty, economic inequality, and housing instability.

Rural and Migrant Ministry, \$20,000.00 to provide outreach to and advocacy for Long Island farmworkers.

Second Chance Reentry, Inc., \$20,000.00 to support a leadership development and civic engagement initiative for the formerly incarcerated in Nassau County.

SEPA Mujer, \$20,000.00 to continue leadership development and advocacy initiative for Latina immigrants in Suffolk County.

The Advocacy Institute, \$20,000.00 to expand legislative advocacy training and resources for Long Island's nonprofits.
