ADELPHI UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK, LONG ISLAND CENTER FOR NONPROFIT LEADERSHIP, Garden City - \$40,000 to support a new array of organizational capacity building programs and services for Long Island nonprofits.

AMERICAN FARMLAND TRUST - \$30,000 to encourage specialty crop farmers to adopt nutrient management practices to reduce the harmful environmental effects of nitrogen loading and runoff.

BAR ASSOCIATION OF NASSAU COUNTY FUND, Mineola - \$15,000 grant to expand a public service project that provides free legal information and assistance in foreclosure matters.

CAUMSETT FOUNDATION, Huntington - \$20,000 to pilot an invasive plant management practice to re-establish the grasslands at Caumsett State Historic Park Preserve.

CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION SERVICES, Roslyn - \$25,000 to launch a comprehensive bullying prevention/intervention program in three Long Island schools.

COALITION AGAINST CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT, Bethpage - \$15,000 grant to support the merger of two organizations that will improve service delivery and benefit victims of family violence.

THE AFTER SCHOOL CORPORATION, New York - \$15,000 grant to start a professional development program focused on science instruction for after-school staff in Long Island schools.

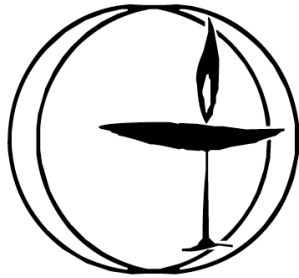
THE RETREAT, East Hampton - \$20,000 grant to prevent violence among at-risk teenage males.

YOUTH ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, Massapequa - \$7,000 grant to support the Violence is Preventable (VIP) project, a comprehensive approach to youth violence intervention.

The Long Island Unitarian Universalist Fund is a field-of-interest fund in the Long Island Community Foundation that promotes progressive social change. The fund was established by the Unitarian Universalist Veatch Program at Shelter Rock. Grants are made in response to competitive proposals received from Long Island nonprofit organizations. The proposals are reviewed by LICF staff and presented to an advisory committee, composed of members drawn from UU congregations across Long Island.

ADELPHI UNIVERSITY INSTITUTE FOR PARENTING, Garden City - \$20,000 grant for advocacy to change judicial practice and improve outcomes for children in the Nassau County child welfare system.

ADELPHI UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK; Long Island Center For Nonprofit Leadership, Garden City - \$40,000 grant to support a new array of organizational capacity-building programs and services for Long Island nonprofits.

ALLIANCE FOR QUALITY EDUCATION, Funds Administrator: Public Policy and Education Fund of New York, Albany - \$20,000 grant to plan a regional grassroots campaign for educational equity on Long Island.

CHILD CARE COUNCIL OF SUFFOLK, Commack - \$11,500 grant to develop leadership skills and increase community involvement among parents in low-income communities in the Town of Islip.
